ANNUAL CHURCH MEETING After morning service on Sunday 10th April.

Tithing: There have been 3 nominations for Charities for this years tithe. They are as follows: **Restoration House Ministries Hull R.H.M.Recovery** is a registered charity based in Hull. It focuses on assisting individuals, couples and families becoming free from their addiction. The Charity is working alongside Selby Street.

Acts435 This charity was inspired by the works of the early Christian Church as described in Acts 4:35. The disciples of the risen Christ shared their possessions and passed money to apostles to give to anyone who had need. Individual churches themselves get involved in identifying needy people to whom gifts are made. Already, we at AP have been

associated with this scheme through the CAP debt centre. Relatively small gifts are given so that as many people as possible are helped. People can apply for help up to three times a year asking for a maximum of £300 per individual per year.

HULL 4 Heroes is another Hull based charity. Following on from their voluntary assistance with the BBC SOS Build in Manchester, this group came home with a wish to make this a reality in Hull. They are looking to transform area where several streets would have 3 or 4 houses that were veterans homes, the remainder would be for the public. There would be a service centre and perhaps a drop in café for everyone. To hear more details and to vote for the charity of your choice, come along to the AGM on April 10th.

CAP Debt Centre Manager. After much prayer and consideration Denise has decided to step down as the CAP Debt Centre Manager at the end of August 2016.
