New White Folding Tables. We have now replaced the seven old brown tables, which used to live in the Trinity Room, with eight brand new white topped folding tables. They are, of course, available for use by any group meeting on Church premises and can be used as working surfaces or can be covered by a table cloth. If the table tops are used uncovered it is important and a matter of respect to other users that they are always left in a clean condition ready for use by others. The tables should be stored, after use, exactly as they are found and great care needs to be taken not to allow damage to occur, especially to the corners of the table tops. The 'folding' operation is not complicated but care should be taken so that fingers do not get pinched as the tables are being folded and unfolded.
